"Yesterday we made "jiaozhi"- the Chinese word for dumplings. We put in wombok, special Chinese sauces and the main ingredient -pork mince. Every kid that was lucky enough to enjoy one of these traditional Asian delicacies reported that they tasted amazing! Most stage 3 kids got about 3 or 4 dumplings and they demolished their dumplings in seconds. If you are a parent reading this newsletter and you'd like to try one of these dumplings, they are available at the school fete on November 3rd. You can purchase them for \$5 for 4 dumplings or \$10 for 9 dumplings. These dumplings are crispy on the outside, with tender, flavourful meat on the inside.

It is great for kids to learn this important part of Chinese culture, because to learn the language properly you have to learn the culture.
